Glossary of Terms

HL – Higher Level courses (3 semesters in length)

CAS – Creative/Action and Service Diploma Requirement (150 volunteer hours)
IB Diploma- Earned after successful completion of 6 IB courses (3 SL and 3 HL), EE, TOK and CAS
IB Certificate – Earned after the successful completion of an IB course by students not enrolled in the full Diploma Programme.

 - Immunization form
 - Report cards grade 7 and 8
